

NEW EXPANDED TRAVEL BAN

THE INFO YOU NEED TO KNOW.

On January 31, 2020, President Trump signed a Presidential Proclamation that expands the existing travel ban to nationals from six new countries. The ban will go into effect on Friday, February 21, 2020. Immigrant visa entry is suspended for the following countries, except Special Immigrant visas based on providing assistance to the US government: Burma (Myanmar), Eritrea, Kyrgyzstan, and Nigeria. For immigrants from Sudan and Tanzania, only Diversity Visa Program entry is suspended.

The Travel Ban does not apply to someone who is seeking admission to the United States on a temporary basis, such as business visitors, tourists, students, exchange students, scholars, and temporary workers. The Travel Ban does not apply to immigrants in the Refugee Resettlement Program.

Waivers

We recommend seeking legal advice from an immigration attorney or Department of Justice (DOJ) accredited organization to determine eligibility for a waiver.
